This course can help to eliminate experiencing embarrassment and penalty. In the Fire academy there is often a waiting list of students wanting to enroll, during this time of waiting the students can enroll in this preparatory course. New Noncredit Course	HEAL 7103	Meditation: Beyond Relaxation Justification: Current medical research indicates that stress adversely impacts health while relaxation, mindfulness, and awareness provide substantial health benefits -- emotionally, physically, and mentally. Although most of us recognize we must handle stress better and learn to relax, it is often difficult for individuals to adopt and incorporate a regular program of stress reduction into their lives on their own. This class provides a structured program of relaxation and concentration to help individuals make stress reduction practice an ongoing part of their daily lives – a healthy habit.
