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Allan Hancock College Concurrent Enrollment Bonanza


Over the past few terms Allan Hancock College has witnessed a large growth in concurrent enrollment (high school students enrolled in AHC courses that are taught in the high schools). There were fewer than 100 concurrent enrollments in spring 2015. However, enrollments grew to over 1,300 in fall 2017. The top three high schools driving this growth are Cabrillo, Orcutt Academy and Santa Ynez High School.

AHC Going Rates of Top Feeder High Schools

- The "Going Rate" (aka Capture Rate) measures the percent of high school graduates enrolling at AHC directly out of high school. Below are data showing the enrollments and going rates from the top feeder high schools to AHC.
- The largest enrollments come from Pioneer, Righetti and Santa Maria High, followed by Cabrillo and Lompoc High. Even though they are in a different county, AHC still draws high school enrollments from both Arroyo Grande and Nipomo High due to proximity to AHC.
- While the previous three fall terms saw AHC going rates between 33.1 & 34.4%, the current
 fall term saw that number drop below 30%. Rumors have floated that more students went to
 universities this fall, but there was only a marginal increase from 8.5% to 8.8% going to the
 CSUs.
- As many as 55 to 60% of high school graduates enroll at AHC within one year of graduation
