## Community says 'Yes!'

Northern Santa Barbara county residents voted June 6 to approve Measure I, the \$180 million general facilities bond to improve Allan Hancock College. Funding from the bond will help the college modernize technology, upgrade the failing infrastructure of decadesold classrooms and labs, and build new teaching and learning spaces.

"June 6 was a historic day for Allan Hancock College and for the communities we serve," said José Ortiz, college superintendent/president. "In voting yes for Measure I, residents sent a clear message that education is important in this valley and that they believe in the future of Allan Hancock College and our community."

As part of the bond requirements, the college will form a citizens' oversight committee that will meet regularly to review the progress of Measure I projects. Committee membership will include citizens who represent business, seniors, taxpayers, and other stakeholders. The college board of trustees is accepting applications from those interested in

Since the bond's passage, the college administration and board of trustees have


reviewed the next steps needed to move forward on various bond-funded projects over the next months. This will include immediate work to implement needed technology upgrades, facilities modernization, and planning for constructing the new Public Safety, Industrial Technology, and One Stop Student centers, among others.

"Now that the bond has passed, we will waste no time in moving forward in our ambitious plans to upgrade and repair teaching facilities and to build needed new ones," said Ortiz. "Allan Hancock College has proudly served the residents of this community for 86 years. With the passage of this bond, we are eager to continue in that service at a higher level of educational excellence. In the meantime, we understand the trust taxpayers have bestowed on us, and will continue all efforts to keep that trust."

Ortiz said the college will be diligent in its efforts to maximize the bond dollars to accomplish as many of the proposed projects as possible.

#### **Campus library reopens**



After months of hammering, sawing, and nailing, the remodeled portion of the Santa Maria campus library reopened for business this spring. The space includes new reference computers, new study spaces,

wireless internet access, and expansive book stacks. The second phase of the construction, a two-story addition, will offer a large, open computer lab, tutorial center, writing center, multimedia production space, an art gallery, private and group study spaces, and more. Phase two should be completed next spring.

In addition, construction is well under way on the Science and Health Occupations Complex and the new Skills Center–both funded by state construction dollars with final costs covered by Measure I funding.

## "BREAKING" into Engineering



Ricardo Garcia liked to break stuff as a kid. When he wasn't breaking things, he was taking them apart.

The second-year mechanical engineering student is still breaking things, but now he is earning grades for it as part of Allan Hancock College's engineering program.

"I liked to mess around with tools," said the 20-year-old Santa Marian. "I was always taking apart our appliances at home—the microwave, the stove, just to see how they work. I like things that move; they just fascinate me."

Garcia was one of several men and women in engineering instructor Dominic Dal Bello's spring 2006 Materials Science class in which students learned about the properties of various materials such as metals, ceramics, and composites by breaking them. The engineers of tomorrow will use this training to develop new, better, and cost-effective materials for the future.

"Engineers are problem-solvers,"
Dal Bello said. "In this class, we
determine a material's characteristics by
doing tests. We also study how atomic
bonding, microscopic structure, and
mechanical and thermal processing
affect the strength of a material and
its other properties because we want
to use the right materials to build
structures—not guess. You only get one
chance to build a bridge."

Allan Hancock College has developed one of the most extensive engineering course offerings of any California community college, according to Dal Bello. His Materials Science class is one of an array of classes that prime students for gaining acceptance into some of the nation's leading engineering universities.

AHC students enjoy more than a 90 percent acceptance rate to top engineering schools such as Cal Poly and University of California, Santa Barbara, as well as UC Berkeley and Cal State, Fresno.

Garcia plans to transfer next year to either Cal Poly, Pomona; Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo; or to UCSB.

And with engineering starting salaries ranging from \$45,000 to \$60,000 and up, students have their pick of careers in electrical, mechanical, civil, biomedical, environmental, aerospace, computer, chemical, and many more fields.

Engineering students garner prestigious internships

Two Allan Hancock College engineering transfer students are spending their summers in prestigious internships at top East Coast universities.

Mechanical engineering and honors student Rogelio Cervantes, 22, a recent Cal Poly transfer, was invited by Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) to participate in its highly-competitive summer undergraduate research program. MIT is the leading graduate university for engineering in the United States, and has been an international center for world-changing, innovative research.

Alma Garcia, 24, who recently transferred to Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo, as an architectural engineering major, is at State University of New York, Buffalo, to study earthquake engineering and structural dynamics. This university has a global reputation as a major center of research in earthquakes and hosts state-of-the-art, high-tech equipment in earthquake simulation. Already in her college career, Garcia has completed two internships at the University of California, Santa Barbara, and received a national engineering research award.

Cervantes and Garcia participated in Allan Hancock College's highly-successful MESA (Math, Engineering, and Science Achievement) program that provides comprehensive academic support, as well as tutoring and study groups, for financially and educationally disadvantaged students who pursue university degrees in math-based majors.

Seven other MESA students have also recently received internships, including an all-expenses-paid engineering study trip to China through San Jose State University's Global Technology Initiative, research in wireless networking technology at Chico State University, and interdisciplinary research in computer engineering at UC Irvine. In addition, through National Science Foundation grant programs, four students are interning at the California NanoSystems Institute at UC Santa Barbara.

## Professor's book sheds new light on the '60s


This year, the first of the baby boomers turns 60. Ironically, "60" is also associated with one of the most dramatic and colorful decades in history—for better or worse—in terms of the social change and the legacy it left behind.

In his latest book, "America in White, Black, and Gray: A History of the Stormy 1960s," Allan Hancock College Professor Klaus Fischer explores this radical decade from a fresh and unique perspective.

"The idea behind the book is to let a different voice talk about the '60s because nearly everything we have heard about this period—the cultural wars, for example—are from voices of the '60s generation," Fischer


said. He is referring to the legacy of rock music, drug usage, free-flowing sexuality, radical politics, and experimentation in "alternative lifestyles."

Fischer, a philosophy and history professor at Allan Hancock College since 1975, came from his home country of Germany to the United States as a teen-ager in 1959, witnessing the 1960s as a new immigrant. President Eisenhower was still in office, and the first of the baby-boom generation (1946-64) was turning 13. He writes from the point of view of both an outsider who emigrated from Germany to the U.S. as well as someone who, in the time since, has become an insider with a stake in America.



"America in White, Black, and Gray" is now in bookstores nationwide. Fischer will also be a featured speaker Oct. 6 during the college's fall 2006 Faculty Lecture Series, at which time signed copies of his books will be available.

Fischer holds a Ph.D. in cultural and intellectual history of modern Europe with expertise in Nazi Germany and the Holocaust. He also authored "The History of an Obsession: German Judeophobia and the Holocaust" (Continuum Publications, 1998) and the acclaimed "Nazi Germany: A New History," (Continuum, 1995), a one-volume history of the Third Reich that is required reading at several universities.

## Hancock students create their own fashion futures

When it comes to fashion, to each his own. And students in Allan Hancock College's fashion studies program are no exception. Students enrolled in the program have personal and professional goals ranging from costume creator to fashion designer.

Russ Cochiolo, a 68-year-old retired history teacher, makes his own historical costumes for reenactment celebrations throughout the West Coast. Over the years, he's portrayed everything from Davey Crocket to a vaquero. And in his case, clothes don't make the man, the man makes the clothes.

"I had no clue about tailoring," he said.
"But I decided it was cheaper and easier to sew them myself."

Students enroll in these fashion classes for a variety of reasons, said instructor Edda Hayes. "Some of them have dreams of getting into the fashion industry; others want to start their own business or simply learn how to sew."

"Last year I made a fur coat for my 21st birthday," said 22-year-old Kimberly Strance, who wants to transfer to San Francisco's Art Institute and one day have her own design business. Her current project is a cruise ship motif summer dress made from Italian cotton.

"I wanted to learn how to make it myself," he said about his first sewing class.

Students can pursue a multitude of careers in every area of fashion design, including tailoring, consulting, accessories—such as handbags and jewelry, and alterations.

"It is reasonable for a successful alterations business to earn up to \$80,000 annually," Hayes said. And you can work from home or own a small neighborhood alterations business. Alterations makes the money; if you can do that, you can do anything."

Student Barbara Hall is making alterations to her daughter's prom dress during class and also wants to have a home-based business.

Rosie Cruz, 20, a second-semester fashion studies major, embellishes her own clothes and wants to start her own fashion line.

Whether a beginner or brushing up on existing skills, students at all levels and career interests can obtain both the one-on-one training and learning experience to reach their goals, Hayes said.

#### **Allan Hancock College Foundation awards** more than \$287,000 in scholarship funds

The Allan Hancock College Foundation awarded 297 scholarships totaling more than \$287,000 to 213 students at its annual awards event. Nearly 700 students, relatives, friends, donors and community members attended the college's 37th annual scholarship ceremony in the Joe White Memorial Gymnasium. Scholarships up to \$10,000 were awarded to students from all parts of the Central Coast, from Solvang to Arroyo Grande.

In keeping with tradition, the Allan Hancock College Associated Student Body Government hosted the evening's event.



A total of 153 donors from the community awarded scholarships to both returning and transferring students through the Allan Hancock College Foundation scholarship program.

The top scholarship winner was Connie L. Havelka of Santa Maria, who received the prestigious Marian

Hancock Scholarship. The scholarship is named for Marian Hancock, the wife of Capt. G. Allan Hancock, for whom the college is named. During her life, Mrs. Hancock was a loyal supporter of the college and the scholarship program.

This award is significant in that it represents the scholarship committee's choice for most outstanding and deserving student of the academic year.

Havelka is described by her professors as "exceptional, very talented, intelligent, cheerful and an absolutely top student." She has worked to fund her college education single-handedly—including securing state and federal

grants, work study, on campus jobs and any other opportunities available. Havelka is the first generation in her family to graduate from college. A single mother of a 2-year-old daughter, she maintained a 3.87 grade point average. She said her educational goal is to earn a bachelor's degree in dental hygiene, not only to provide for her daughter, but to use her skills to volunteer in clinics for disadvantaged families and children. "I am going to do more than just clean teeth. I will educate people at a young age to help them form good hygiene habits that will last a lifetime. Reaching out to families and children who think they cannot afford good dental care is my ultimate goal," said Havelka.

She was also recently selected as EOPS/CARE student of the year.

Another featured scholarship winner was Kevin Taulbee of Lompoc. Taulbee was awarded the \$10,000 Edwin O'Neill Law Enforcement Scholarship. The award is disbursed over two years. Edwin O'Neill was a pioneer in methods of scientific detection in law enforcement in the 1930s and worked for many years at the crime detection laboratory at Northwestern University and later at the Chicago Police Department. O'Neill, a longtime resident of Santa Maria who passed away in 1993, selected Allan Hancock College to continue his legacy of excellence in law enforcement. Taulbee will transfer to California State University, Fresno, this fall to work toward obtaining a bachelor's degree in criminology. He plans to work in investigative law enforcement.


## **New board members**

#### Highlights of 2005/2006

This has been a year of "Highlights" for the Allan Hancock College Foundation. Generous gifts received from individuals, businesses and organizations have benefited the students, faculty, programs and facilities of the college. We would like to share just a few of those highlights with you here:

- During this past year, college employees have contributed \$67,189 to the foundation. That list of donors includes many faculty and staff who have raised their commitment to student success above and beyond just "doing their job."
- The foundation provided funding to the college's faculty development committee to supplement travel for professional development, and created a quarterly "Outstanding Faculty Award" to recognize the exemplary faculty at Allan Hancock College.

Outstanding individual performances highlighted the 2006 spring season of sports at Allan Hancock College, as 16 student athletes earned either All-Western State Conference recognition or qualified for state post-conference competition. Additionally, a total of 43 spring-sport athletes earned All-WSC Academic Team honors.

Freshman track-and-field athlete Jesus Solis won the WSC title in the 3,000-meter steeplechase, the 10,000-meter run and the 5,000-meter run. At the State Championship Meet, the Righetti High grad finished fourth in the steeplechase and fifth in the 5,000 meters, and was named the WSC's Male Athlete of the Year.

The 2006 men's golf season was highlighted by AHC serving as host of the Southern California Regional Tournament at beautiful Santa Maria Country Club. Three Bulldogs qualified for the event, including sophomore Justin Warthen and freshmen Chad Jackson and Brian Wiggins.

In baseball, the campus diamond was formally named for longtime head coach and former athletic director John Osborne. The opportunity was provided by the Hancock College Boosters, Inc., which made a three-year, \$115,000 commitment to athletic facility improvements.

In other sports news, Coach Chris Stevens' Bulldog baseball team saw nine players earn All-WSC recog-


## Hancock film student wins media arts award
