Police Week

College Corps Kickoff

On May 19 I joined California Chief Service Officer Josh Fryday and leaders from Cuesta College and Cal Poly, SLO, to encourage students to apply for the #CaliforniansForAll College Corps program — a new opportunity for thousands of California college students to serve their communities in critical issue areas such as climate action, education, and food insecurity. Fire Academy Graduation

On May 19, 21 cadets graduated from Hancock's Fire Academy. On May 20, PCPA and Hancock's Facilities Department joined our Campus Police Department to complete the second part of their "Stop the Bleed" safety training. This program trains employees to learn life-saving techniques such as applying direct pressure, packing wounds, and using a tourniquet to stop bleeding. 
2022 Retirement & Recognition Ceremony




Viticulture and Enology 5K Fun Run

AHC Student Named PTK All-California Award Winner

Covid-Testing and Prize Drawing

Our students and employees did an excellent job ensuring a safe and healthy return to campus after spring break. A total of 630 individuals took a Covid-19 test on-campus between March 27 and March 29. Only one positive result was reported (an off-campus student), resulting in a positivity rate of 0.15 percent. A total of 10 employees and 12 students won prizes as the result of drawing of all those who tested during that three-day period.

CORE Graduation

After 220 hours of intensive training, nine recruits graduated Hancock's CORE Custody Academy on April 1 at the Public Safety Training Complex in Lompoc. All nine of the CORE Academy graduates will go on to work as custody deputies for the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office.


Nutrition Day




"Upcycle" Fashion Show

Bellwether Presentation

This week, we traveled to the 2022 Bellwether College Consortium's College Futures Assembly in San Antonio, TX, to make the case for how Hancock's "Credit Where Credit's Due" auto degree-awarding program has changed the odds for our students. While Hancock was not selected as a Bellwether award recipient, we were proud to be named as finalists and to be able to share the inspiring stories of the students who benefited from the program, as well as how our college rose to the challenge of removing barriers and supporting student success.

LVC Launch to College

Students from Cabrillo High School and Lompoc High School visited the Lompoc Valley Center to participate in a Launch to College event on March 4. During the event, Hancock's staff welcomed these new Bulldogs and conducted new student orientations, answered questions about registering for classes, reviewed financial aid information, and provided information about important student support services and resources.





Evening Childcare Program

The Orfalea Children's Center at the Santa Maria campus is once again offering free evening childcare for eligible student-parents of children 3-5 years old who qualify for Child Care Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS) services. The CCAMPIS program supports low-income parents in postsecondary education through the provision of campus-based child care services. Enrollment and the hours of care are based on the students' class schedules and units enrolled. Eligible student-parents can also receive 2 hours of study time per unit. 
Equity Summit






Hancock Debuts TimelyMD Telehealth Service for Students

Vaccine and Testing Requirements Begin

Vaccine and testing requirements for Hancock students began on Oct. 4. Students now must use our new Vax Check tool to either upload proof of vaccination or submit proof of a negative COVID-19 test within three days of coming to campus. As of Friday, more than 7,800 of our students are fully vaccinated and eligible for a "fast pass" to enter campus. We continue to communicate with students and staff, and continue to offer free testing on both the Santa Maria campus and Lompoc Valley Center.




New Foxworthy Gallery Exhibition

AHC Vax Check Tool Rollout

Vax Check will allow both our students and staff to upload their proof of vaccination or COVID test results. 


Covid-19 Vaccination and Testing Requirements




EOPS BEST Speakers Series






Covid-19 On-Campus Testing Continues




Banned Books Week Scavenger Hunt

Student Health Screenings

This week, we successfully piloted a student health screening process, directing all students entering campus to six points of entry on the Santa Maria campus and one point of entry at the Lompoc Valley Center. To help ease the process, the college is launching a digital screening tool for students beginning Monday. Students will be directed to log into the college's online health assessment survey at https://bit.ly/AHC_COVID_Screening. Answering a few questions will result in clearing students to come onto campus.

Vaccination Incentive Program

This week, we <u>distributed</u> nearly 3,000 \$250 Visa gift cards to fully vaccinated students as part of Hancock's <u>Student Vaccine Incentive Program</u>. The cards were handed out to eligible students on Aug. 23 and again on Aug. 26. We continue to encourage our students to get fully vaccinated and will distribute another round of gift cards on Aug. 31.





#GetSocialAHC

Student Activities is encouraging our returning Bulldog students to get involved on-campus and "Get Social" this fall though the #GetSocialAHC campaign. As part of this new program, student can pick up a "passport", which can be stamped at AHC events and redeemed for prizes and rewards. Several of our student ambassadors and athletes have <u>taken to social media</u> to encourage their peers to take part in the program using the #GetSocialAHC hashtag.




First Day of Fall Classes
